- **SSB (School Saving Bonus)** provides a one-off \$400 to help Victorian families cover the costs of their child's school uniforms, textbooks, excursions and activities for 2025. Please visit School Saving Bonus for more information.
- CSEF (Camps Sports and Excursions Fund) provided by DET and is automatically paid to family accounts. Applications
  are made via the school. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible
  to apply. \$225 per year paid for eligible secondary school students. Special consideration eligibility category also exists.
  CSEF payments will be processed directly to schools with majority of payments to commence from March 2025
  onwards.

## Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.
